| 11:00 - 16.00 | 'Writing for publication' an Editorial workshop on how to publish simulation and education studies | Professor Nick Sevdalis - Editor in Chief of BMJ STEL, Associate Editor of Implementation Science and Professor of Implementation Science Henry Spilberg Associate Publisher BMJ | <p>This session is an introductory combined lecture and workshop led jointly by the Chief Editor of BMJ Simulation & Technology Enhanced Learning peer-reviewed journal, Professor Nick Sevdalis of KCL and Mr Henry Spilberg of the BMJ.</p> <p>The session focuses on how to get simulation and education research published in peer-reviewed journals. The session covers elements of the editorial and publisher perspectives on peer-reviewed submissions; common pitfalls; structuring of manuscripts; and a brief overview of the 'publication journey' – an integrated view of turning original ideas into peer-reviewed articles. The session also details the editorial policies and priorities of BMJ Simulation and Technology Enhanced Learning.</p> <p>The session includes hands-on work by the delegates to illustrate problems in writing for publication and strategies to address them.</p> | Waterfront Suite 1 |

Attendees will have the opportunity to examine their own projects to see how well the innovation process has worked for them and take away an understanding of how being innovators can continue to grow the success of simulation and be an exemplar for innovative working in healthcare.</p> | Waterfront Suite 3 |
| 11:00 - 16.00 | The science, practice and evidence supporting effective 'in situ' simulation | Prof Bryn Baxendale, ASPiH Human Factors SIG Co-Chair Dr Al Ross, ASPiH Human Factors SIG Co-Chair & Members of the Nursing & Midwifery Institute, Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust | <p>The use of 'in situ' simulation is becoming increasingly popular as a method to enable qualified staff to develop and rehearse critical skills in their own clinical setting. In addition, many groups are using it as a method to identify latent threats or other safety hazards in their workplace.</p> <p>This workshop will present current evidence to support the use of 'in situ' simulation for these purposes in different health and social care contexts.</p> <p>Participants will then be asked to discuss and critique a new conceptual framework and theory of practice pertinent to this area of practice being developed by the workshop facilitators. The aim is to produce a robust version of the framework to be tested in the field.</p> <p>The next step in validation will be to design and evaluate 'in situ' interventions in practice using the framework, to support practitioners in its application and further refinement, and help build the evidence base for this form of intervention.</p> <p>To facilitate this, the workshop will conclude by identifying a limited number of 'in situ' simulation pilot projects which could benefit from being informed by the supporting framework. Participants and their centres/institutions will be invited to participate in these projects during 2019 as part of a co-ordinated multicentre programme.</p> | Waterfront Suite 4 |
